The Hour I First Believed by Wally Lamb

In The Hour I First Believed, Lamb travels well beyond his earlier work and embodies in his fiction myth, psychology, family history stretching back many generations, and the questions of faith that lie at the heart of everyday life. The result is an extraordinary tour de force, at once a meditation on the human condition and an unflinching yet compassionate evocation of character.



When forty-seven-year-old high school teacher Caelum Quirk and his younger wife, Maureen, a school nurse, move to Littleton, Colorado, they both get jobs at Columbine High School. In April 1999, Caelum returns home to Three Rivers, Connecticut, to be with his aunt who has just had a stroke. But Maureen finds herself in the school library at Columbine, cowering in a cabinet and expecting to be killed, as two vengeful students go on a carefully premeditated, murderous rampage.

2025 Middle School Mission Trip to Duluth, Minnesota

Back in June, ten middle school students and three adult leaders from Sharon Lutheran Church spent a week in Duluth with an organization called YouthWorks. During the week, they served with community partners such as Benedictine Health Services, Bayshore Care Center, Churches United Food Bank, Damiano Center, Duluth Parks & Recreation, Duluth Stream Corps, and Valley Youth Center. They also participated in a prayer walk, heard from a community member about Duluth's strengths and challenges, and explored the area, including visits to Park Point Beach, Canal Park, and Enger Tower. After checking



out of the housing site, the group traveled to the Twin Cities to pack meals for Feed My Starving Children, enjoy a time of recreation at Dave & Busters, and gather for a final night of fellowship and worship before returning home.

This experience was centered around the theme of "Dust." In Jesus' time, there was a saying: "Be covered in the dust of your rabbi." Disciples were expected to follow their teacher's footsteps so closely that they'd be covered in the dust that was kicked up. These trip participants definitely learned to follow Jesus closely, and they are covered in dust. Please ask them about their experiences, and listen for more stories in the weeks to come!



Many wonderful things have happened:

We are incredibly grateful to a **member** of Sharon who also gave the Properties Board a gift of

\$5,000.00.

A \$700.00 grant was given from the Sharon Endowment Fund.

A generous grant was also from the following:

The Board of the **Walter and Barbara (Reishus) Pederson Lutheran Foundation** awarded our church **\$4,500.00** to apply toward the church hallway and room lighting project.
